





Michael Hardt teaches in the Literature Program at Duke University. He is co-author with Antonio Negri of the Empire trilogy: Empire (Harvard University Press, 2000); Multitude: War and Democracy in the Age of Empire (Penguin Books, 2004); Commonwealth (Belknap Press, 2009); and, most recently, Declaration (Argo Navis Author Services, 2012). Michael Hardt's forthcoming lecture, "Multitudes in Revolt, from Tahrir to Taksim," will consider how a cycle of struggles characterized by occupations and encampments have spread through different parts of the world in the last three years. The talk aims to grasp the importance of these global struggles and to recognize the primary challenges they face. Of particular interest, Hardt's lecture investigates the role of organization and leadership in these "leaderless" movements.
